 - Approximately \$104,000 in bank
 - Mayor Adams may make up to 15% in cuts. We are in good shape for now but may run into trouble if that happens
 - PTA Budget Proposal (see below)
 - Budget shows how we spend and make money
 - It's a living document so we can change it collectively
 - Can't spend money until we approve the budget
 - We often have to pay for things that break: DOE vendors are expensive and not convenient. Other expenses like end of year recognition, residencies, musical show kits and so much more

- Will we have the Cool Culture Pass again this year?
 - Yes. For 3K-K
- What is our annual funding goal?
 - **\$100,000**
- How long will the scaffolding be up?
 - The School Construction Authority put it up 6 years ago. Was supposed to be an emergency shed for facade work. Will most likely be another couple of years
 - The are now working on:
 - Accessibility upgrade including an elevator, widened hallways etc.
 - New boiler is being installed
- How does a school get the G&T program?
 - Your child can test into it for Kindergarten through the district or citywide
 - Adams has started a track in 3rd grade for each district
 - Superintendent picked PS 84 because we are a diverse community
- What is PBL (Project Based Learning, i.e. PS 84's G&T program)?
 - Deep dive on regular curriculum. Unlike PS 132, the class learns the same curriculum at the same speed as other concurrent classes but just digs a bit deeper into them.
 - A handful of teachers have been trained and are trying to spread best practices through the school
- What does the school do really well and what do they need to work on?
 - Really well: seeing kids for who they are and seeing them as capable. Staff is kind
 - Work on: keeping open lines of communication. They are very child focused and sometimes don't communicate with parents as much as they wish


